Additional Areas of Interest:

*(T) Java resident started rabies post exposure shots after being bitten by a skunk. The skunk entered his house through a dog door and as the individual grabbed the skunk to throw him back outside it bit his hand. The skunk was not captured for rabies testing.

This office assists other state agencies as needed in the rabies program. Such is the case with the Eland Antelope being housed at Hidden Valley Animal Adventure in Varysburg. This animal was submitted by authorization of a NYS Agriculture and Markets veterinarian as part of the diagnostic process.

On October 14th the fifth and final 2017 rabies vaccination clinic was held by this department. The clinic was held at the County Highway Garage in Rock Glen and there were 318 vaccinations given (248 dogs, 70 cats). 2017 clinic vaccination numbers were down about 10% from the previous year with a total of 1,062 vaccinations (830 dogs, 229 cats, 3 ferrets) being given. We believe this is a result of 2 of the 5 clinics having poor weather conditions. The March 11th clinic had heavy snow and the June 15th clinic was held during a steady rain event. This office received \$1,904.31 in donations and out of county resident fees during the five clinics.

This department, and the WCWRA, continues to assist the Village of Arcade after fire destroyed the facility that housed the Water/Sewer and Electric department's vehicles and equipment. They are currently evaluating the extent of the damage to the equipment and supplies.

This office has been working with NYSDEC in the site review of an oil spill that occurred at a private residence on Dersam Road, (T) Bennington. The spill occurred after a home heating oil fuel line failed discharging oil into the residence utility room. Remediation guidance is being conducted by NYSDEC. It was originally suspected that the water supply for the home may have been compromised but further testing by the department determined it was not. NYSDOH has an Oil Spill Temporary Relocation Program available for residents affected by oil spills while the remediation work is completed but in this case the homeowner did not relocate.
