Additional Areas of Interest:

*1. A (V) Arcade resident started rabies post exposure shots after being bitten by a feral cat and the cat could not be found for a 10-day confinement or testing. Feral cats continue to be a growing concern in most communities.

* 2. The second individual that started rabies post exposure shots was a Syracuse resident that was visiting Letchworth State Park and was bitten by a dog while staying in one of the camping areas. This department worked with the NYS Park Police trying to locate the owner of the dog for several days but was unsuccessful in locating the dog's owner. Therefore post exposure shots were recommended. With the bite occurring in Wyoming County, this county is responsible for the treatment and worked with Onondaga County to ensure the individual received the shots.

During the month of June a Boil Water Order was issued to a non-community public water system by this department for:

- A Foodservice Establishment, (T) Orangeville, for inadequate disinfection in the potable water supply.

On June 6th and 15th Anti-Rabies Vaccination Clinics were held in Perry and Arcade respectively. There were a total of 209 animals (172 – Dogs, 37 – Cats) vaccinated at the Perry clinic and 173 animals (138 – Dogs, 34 – Cats, 1 - Ferret) vaccinated at the Arcade clinic. Combined, a total of \$830.31 was collected in donations and out of county fees. Forty-eight animals were from out of the county.

A Notice of Violation was issued to a Mobile Food Operation, (T) Arcade, for continued operation of a Mobile Food stand without an operational permit.

A meeting was held with the (T) Java and subsequently with Java Colony Association members to discuss ongoing waste water disposal issues around Java Lake and the possibility of creating a municipal type sewer district to address these concerns. Grant funding is currently available through NYS DEC to potentially cover up to 85% of this type of project. Further discussion is planned.
