Additional Areas of Interest:

On June 5th and 14th Anti-Rabies Vaccination Clinics were held in Perry and Arcade respectfully. There were a total of 177 animals (111 – Dogs, 66 – Cats) vaccinated at the Perry clinic and 153 animals (102 – Dogs, 51 – Cats) vaccinated at the Arcade clinic. Combined, a total of \$593.00 was collected in donations and out of county fees. Thirty-one animals were from out of the county.

During the month of June three Boil Water Orders was issued to a non-community public water system by this department for:

- A Foodservice Establishment, Recreational Campground and Children's Camp facility for inadequate disinfection in the potable water supply. All of the establishments have returned to normal operation are correcting the deficiencies and completing the required confirmatory water sampling.

Multiple water quality samples were collected at regulated bathing beaches within the county during the month of June. Several sample results were high in e-coli resulting in repeat samples being collected and the temporary closing of the effected beaches. All beaches were re-opened after satisfactory repeat samples were collected.

This office is currently working with NY Rural Water to offer a laboratory training course in the County for water operators. NY Rural Water offers the course around the state each year, but it has been a number of years since it was within our county or the western region. Every three years the certified surface water supply operators as well as the wastewater operators are required to take this six hour course on laboratory methods using instrumentation. The course is currently scheduled to be held on September 11th at the Ag and Business Center in Warsaw and will be open to system operators in the western region.
