**PRESS RELEASE**

**March 20, 2020 @ 2:00 p.m.**

Chairman of the Wyoming County Board of Supervisors, Jerry L. Davis, reports: “As of 1:00 p.m. today, we still only have one case of COVID-19 confirmed, which was from the Northwest Quadrant. We have had ten cases, which were negative for COVID-19. There are twenty-eight results pending over the coming days and more confirmed cases are expected. When an individual is tested, they are quarantined until test results are available. If the test is positive, health officials will notify close contacts to provide instructions, including monitoring for symptom development.

As the incidence of COVID-19 increases in Wyoming County, residents who develop symptoms including a fever over 100.4, cough, and difficulty breathing should self-quarantine and care for themselves at home. Call your healthcare provider for advice and avoid the Emergency Room unless it is a true medical emergency.

Testing kits are in short supply and after repeated requests to the State of New York, we have been unable to secure additional test kits. Personal protective equipment is another limited resource in short supply and those requests have been pending for over a week.

New York Governor, Andrew Cuomo, announced today employees of non-essential businesses are required to stay home in an effort to combat the spread of the coronavirus pandemic. Governor Cuomo also announced businesses that do not comply with the new mandate will be subject to civil fines and mandatory closures.

My understanding regarding the essential manufacturing of food production and processing is still considered essential. This would also include businesses that support this vital role of food production. I

**still encourage you to please reduce your staff when able. If you believe your business is essential, the following guidance is suggested: limit your hours, limit the amount of people in your business to ensure social distancing, and limit the use of cash. I encourage you to reach out to Scott Gardner from the Wyoming County Chamber of Commerce. Scott will be working with the county EOC on short term and long term needs of our county businesses. **Remember that the constant flow of information may create anxiety. To keep your anxiety to a minimum, limit yourself to checking social media and/or trusted news outlets to once or twice per day. Eat healthy foods, drink plenty of water, and try to get a good amount of sleep. Spend time outside if you're able. Virtually reach out to support networks, family, friends and your faith community. Look for positive moments throughout your day. If you begin to feel overwhelmed, or find that you're struggling to cope, know that you are not alone. Please call the Wyoming County Crisis Line at 585-283-5200 for assistance and support.**

**The Director of Fire and Emergency Management, Brian Meyers, has opened our county Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to coordinate the overall response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The EOC'S primary mission to support county operations and direct COVID-19 incident needs.**

**Chief Executive Officer, Joseph McTernan, of the Wyoming County Community Health System has also opened the Hospital Command Center (HCC) to support impending surge capacity and day to day operations of the health system. They will work in conjunction with the county EOC to attempt to secure needed resources of first responders, public health and health system staff.**

**As a reminder, we will not be releasing specific information regarding residency. Our environment and population is different than Erie and Monroe Counties, for example the population in the Town of Cheektowaga is twice that of the entire County of Wyoming. However, we want to be as transparent to our concerning public as we can while maintaining our legal and privacy obligations. For our purposes regarding residency, we will be breaking down the county townships and reporting in quadrants:**

- 1. Northwest- Attica, Bennington, Orangeville, Sheldon**
- 2. Southwest- Arcade, Eagle, Java, Wethersfield**
- 3. Southeast- Castile, Gainesville, Genesee Falls, Pike**
- 4. Northeast- Covington, Middlebury, Perry, Warsaw**

**Remember, most people with COVID-19 can recover at home. Please stay at home as much as possible and take sensible precautions including avoiding crowds, frequent handwashing, the six feet social**

distancing practices and avoid touching your face. Please check on community members that might need assistance, be a good neighbor - this is what we do in Wyoming County. Thank you to everyone who has offered to volunteer their assistance. A future update will give more information on how to volunteer where you are needed most. Residents are urged not to respond to unreliable information. Consult the CDC and NYSDOH websites for federal and state updates and the Wyoming County website for daily local updates. Call the NYS COVID-19 hotline at 888-364-3065 with general questions. Finally, our lives have certainly been interrupted by all these changes – things definitely look different than they did just a couple weeks ago. Someone said recently, it will be impossible to know if we over-reacted or did too much...but it will be quite apparent if we under-reacted or did too little. Thank you for doing your part.

If you think you have been exposed to Coronavirus (COVID-19) and develop a fever and symptoms, such as cough or difficulty breathing, call your healthcare provider for medical advice. Please don't just present yourself at the Emergency Room or your Doctor's office. It is vital you call your healthcare provider in advance, which also allows for preparation of patients. Current measures being taken are to prevent and slow the spread of COVID-19 and to protect the health of residents.
