The holidays can be a particularly difficult time and we keep everyone in our thoughts and prayers at this normally festive season of the year,” said Rebecca Ryan, Chair of the Wyoming County Board of Supervisors. *“With widespread community infection rates at an all-time high, it is more important than ever to exercise all safe social distancing behaviors. Wyoming County residents are reminded that the safest way to celebrate winter holidays is at home with the people who live with you. Even though we want to celebrate with all of our loved ones, travel and gatherings with family and friends who do not live with you can increase your chances of getting or spreading COVID-19 or the flu. Celebrating virtually or with the people you live with is the safest choice this winter.”*

As of Tuesday, December 22, 2020, the Wyoming County Health Department reports nine hundred thirty-five (935) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. This is an increase of sixteen (16) cases from the last reported increase on Monday, December 21, 2020.
