**The Wyoming County Health Department will be offering FREE
COVID-19 rapid tests for those who live or work in Wyoming County**

Registration is full for the rapid testing clinic on Tuesday, December 29th

The next community drive through testing event will be Wednesday, January 6th
Details and registration information will be announced by Wednesday, December 30th

How can I get a COVID-19 test in Wyoming County?

Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Monday, December 28, 2020, the Wyoming County Health Department reports one thousand forty-two (1,042) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. This is an increase of sixty-three (63) cases from the last reported increase on Thursday, December 24, 2020.

From the New York State Department of Health: The first New Yorkers to receive the COVID-19 vaccine as part of the New York State Vaccination Plan in Phase 1 will be high-risk hospital workers, nursing home residents, nursing home staff, EMS workers, certain long-term and congregate care residents and staff, other health care workers, coroners, funeral homes and medical examiners.
