COVID-19 rapid tests for those who live or work in Wyoming County**

This site is drive through only - all individuals should remain in their cars.

How can I get a COVID test in Wyoming County?

NEW: From November 29 through December 3, 2020: the Health Department reports that among the active positive COVID-19 cases during that time period, nineteen (19) Wyoming County residents were admitted to hospitals across the region and three (3) active cases received emergency care. Going forward, this information will be reported in aggregate each Friday for the previous 7 day period.

Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of earlier today, Friday, December 04, 2020, the Wyoming County Health Department reports five hundred forty-eight (548) lab-confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. This is an increase of thirty-one (31) cases from the last reported increase on Thursday, December 03, 2020.

W Wyoming County is experiencing widespread community transmission of COVID-19. Please wear face coverings, maintain social distance, practice good hand hygiene and do not be around others if you are sick.
