***A personal message from Rebecca J. Ryan,
Chairwoman of the Wyoming County Board of Supervisors:***

Wyoming County continues to see an increase in COVID-19 spread, originating from family, social and congregate gatherings. With the colder weather, we find ourselves spending most of our time indoors where the warm, dry air is the perfect environment for us and for the virus.

The more time we spend with people who are not part of our immediate family, especially indoors, the greater the risk of getting or spreading COVID-19. As we look to 2021, we need to carefully reconsider attending traditional large holiday parties and take reasonable precautions.

Please remain vigilant, wash your hands frequently, wear a face covering, maintain social distancing, avoid gatherings and stay home when sick. If we continue to do these things, we can prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Remember, there is an end in sight and we are almost there; we can't afford to go backwards now...

Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Thursday, December 31, 2020, the Wyoming County Health Department reports one thousand one hundred thirty-four (1,134) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. This is an increase of forty-one (41) cases from the last reported increase on Wednesday, December 30, 2020.

From the New York State Department of Health: The first New Yorkers to receive the COVID-19 vaccine as part of the New York State Vaccination Plan in Phase 1 will be high-risk hospital workers, nursing home residents, nursing home staff, EMS workers, certain long-term and congregate care residents and staff, other health care workers, coroners, funeral home workers and medical examiners.
