From the Wyoming County Department of Health:

If you are a member of the Phase 1A or 1B Priority Population according to the NYS Department of Health [“Phased Distribution of the Vaccine”](#) guidelines, you are currently eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccination. Each week New York State is very specific about who is eligible to be vaccinated at particular locations. [Here](#) is a current list of locations in Wyoming County that are registered with New York State as vaccine clinics, including the population they are able to vaccinate, per NYS. Appointments are subject to vaccine availability on a weekly basis.

The Wyoming County Health Department will host a Moderna COVID-19 vaccination clinic on Wednesday, March 3rd. NYS has mandated this clinic be *only for essential workers in Priority Population 1B* (this includes fire, law enforcement, public safety/communications, corrections, P-12 education employees, in-person college faculty, employees of registered group childcare programs, public transit, public-facing grocery workers, restaurant employees and others). Individuals being vaccinated must bring proof of eligibility to the vaccination site. This could be an employee ID card, a letter from an employer or affiliated organization, or a pay stub.

An appointment is required in order to be vaccinated. Registration will be announced shortly at www.wyomingco.net by choosing “COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Registration” under *County Quick Links*.

Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Thursday, February 25, 2021, the Wyoming County Health Department reports two thousand eighty-nine (2,089) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. This is an increase of five (5) cases from the last reported increase on Wednesday, February 24, 2021.
