- Thursday, February 10, 2022 Governor Hochul announced the broader statewide indoor mask mandate has been lifted. Certain settings will still require all individuals to wear a mask including state-regulated health care settings, adult care facilities and nursing homes; schools and childcare centers (though Governor Hochul indicated that school masking requirements will be re-evaluated in early March); correctional facilities; shelters; and public transportation (buses, trains, airports, etc.).
- There is no mask requirement in Wyoming County buildings, for either employees or visitors, except for the following:

Health Department Testing and Vaccination Clinics

Please continue to practice safe health measures such as frequent hand-washing and use of hand-sanitizer. Anyone who feels more comfortable wearing face-masks when in close proximity to others should do so. If you are sick, please stay home.

- Wyoming County residents can visit www.wyomingco.net and choose “Report a Positive COVID-19 Home Test” option under *Quick Links* to self-report a positive at home COVID-19 test. After submitting a positive result you will be able to print an “AFFIRMATION OF ISOLATION” if needed for school or work. The state is moving to self-management for anyone who tests positive or who is exposed.
- The Wyoming County Health Department will offer **COVID-19 testing on Monday and Thursday** each week. Testing will be “drive through” style at the Wyoming County Highway Department located at 4328 Route 19, approximately 4 miles south of the Village of Warsaw. Results are available the same day and there is no charge. Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Thursday, February 10, 2022, the Wyoming County Health Department reports seven thousand five hundred ninety-three (7,593) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. There is an increase of eighty-nine (89) total cases since the last reported increase on Thursday, February 3, 2022.
